Event:	Virtual KS1 Key Steps Gymnastics and SEND Competition
Who:	<p>Team Competition Format <u>Key Stage 1 -Years 1 / 2 Teams</u> There is one competition category working to the Key Step Level 1 activities. Children in these teams may be new to gymnastics or may participate in a school &/or community gymnastics club recreational class working on basic fundamental skills. This event is not suitable for children who participate in gymnastics for several hours a week, or who are in community gymnastics clubs working towards competitions within a floor and vault or discipline specific squad.</p> <p><u>Disabled participants Individual Competition</u> Pupils with a disability may participate in the team events above or as individuals as outlined below with direct entry to County Final at the discretion of the school: Disabled participants Years 1 – 6 working to Step 1 routines Disabled participants Years 1 – 6 working to Step 2 routines</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Category 1 - Learning Disability. (Autism / MLD / EBD /SLD) • Category 2; Physical Disability & Sensory Impairments <p><u>Rules</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KS1 Teams of 4 - must include at least one girl and one boy (Maximum of 2 virtual entries per school) • SEND individual • All children in the team must attempt all 3 activities <p><u>General Competition Rules</u></p> <p>*The competition will be run in accordance with the English Gymnastics Key Step Programme. *Routines will be judged in accordance with the rules set out in the Key Step resource pack. *Dress: - 'T'-Shirt and Shorts or leotards; Bare feet. Long hair tied back. *No communication from Team Manager (does not apply to disabled participants)</p>
Where and When:	<p>Virtual Event Term 1 and 2</p> <p>Submission by Video – if a team event please record the team together SEND pupils can be recorded individually</p> <p>We welcome entries from both curriculum lessons and extra-curricular school gymnastic clubs. It is our suggestion that every school runs their own Intra-School competition to find a winner in each category. We advise that your Intra-School competition should be organised well in advance of the entry open and close period.</p>

Entries must be submitted by a member of school staff, who sends a completed official entry form and the video via WeTransfer (wetransfer.com) using laura.rookard@aylesford.kent.sch.uk . Entries will not be accepted without an accompanying official Team Sheet.

You do not need to log in or create an account with WeTransfer in order to send your entries. No email or mail entries will be accepted.

The name and school of the video of the winning 1st, 2nd and 3rd place entries in each category may be published on the Kent School Games social media channels. A select number may also be chosen for a celebration compilation video. If consent is not given please ensure that this has been acknowledged on the team sheet in the photo consent column.
